Professor Kokot made the class a great environment for discussion and let us engage with the material on our own and find ways to apply it without his direction. He fostered a room where everybody could share their own opinion and grow. The lectures gave us the information we needed while also letting us be involved with other classmates and talk about the material. This class teaches students how to form their own arguments and have constructive conversations in addition to learning fascinating material.

In class discussions

The aspects that I found the most valuable for learning was having access to the lecture notes after class, outside resources that were recommended by the professor to search up different terms in philosophy and learning how to read philosophy texts. Another aspect that was valuable for learning was our reflection exercises that occurred throughout the course and helped you to develop skills in writing an introduction to a philosophy paper under a certain text limit, which helped you to refine your argument and develop the main points of your argument. I think this aspect helped me to not only improve my argumentative writing, but to also engage a lot more with the philosophy texts and consider different arguments or weaknesses that could be taken away from the philosophy texts we read, and then create an argument for or against the philosophical beliefs.

What suggestions would you make to the instructor Jordan Kokot for improving the course?

Comments

The professor is very clearly passionate about the course material. The only thing I would say is to keep up the great work, thank you for the amazing class.

You're one of the best lecturers I've ever had and your feedback on the reflections is good and helpfully critical.
